






Tyrannosaurus




Apatosaurus




Corythosaurus

Pterodactylus snopped insects from the air as it flew about during the Jurassic period (208–145 million years ago).



The plant-eating Stegosaurus lived during the lush Jurassic period (208–145 million years ago). The bony plates on its back may have absorbed heat from the sun. The Stegosaurus was up to 8 m long.



The Spinosaurus was a meat-eating dinosaur of the Cretaceous period (145–64 million years ago). It was up to 12 m long.



Velociraptor

Velociraptor means 'speedy killer'. It was a vicious meat-eating dinosaur of the late Cretaceous period (110–64 million years ago). The Velociraptor lived in the desert areas of what is now Mongolia and China. Due to terrible dust storms, they either choked to death or were buried alive in sand dunes.
