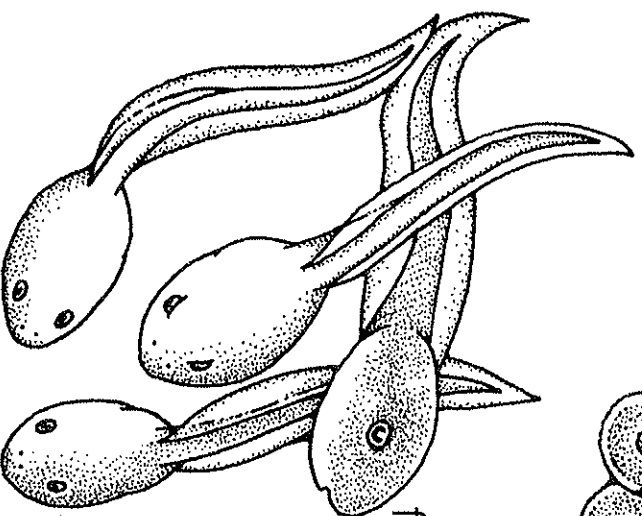


tadpoles developing
in the eggs

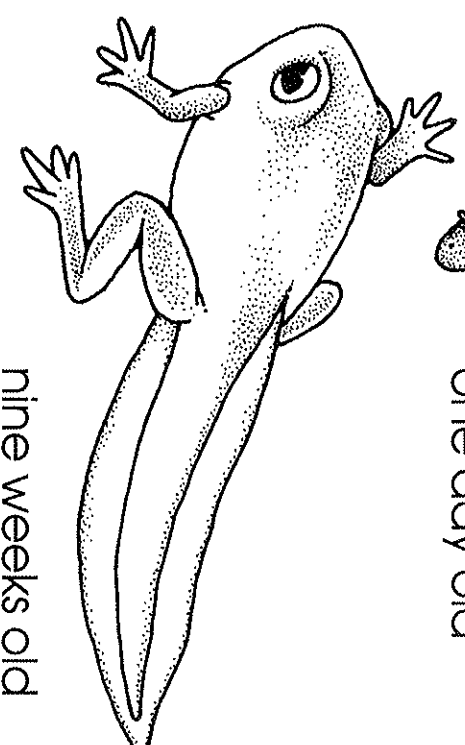
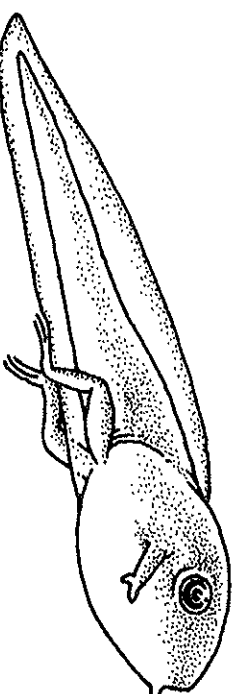

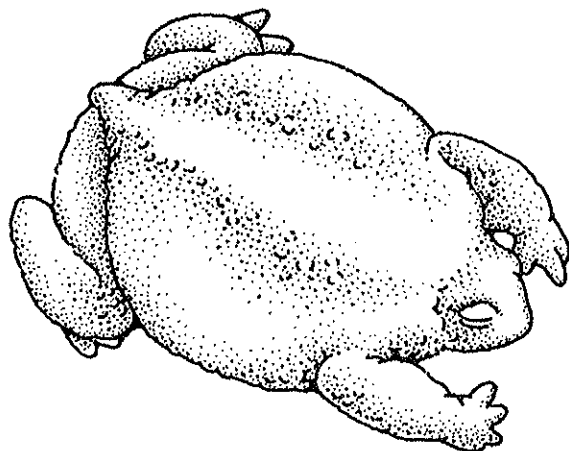
