

# Stone Age Goal Chart



## Supplies\*:

- Brown paper roll
- Scissors
- Masking tape
- Medium-sized box
- Green felt
- Paper grocery bags
- Plastic gallon milk jugs
- Staple and staplers
- Dark gray spray paint
- White 8-½" x 11" paper
- Hot glue and glue sticks
- Dowel rod
- Duct tape
- Artificial greenery

## Directions:

1. Cover an area of wall with brown paper roll.
2. Cover a medium-sized box loosely with green felt and place on floor at the bottom of your display.
3. Open up nine paper bags to create rocks. Push the four bottom corners of each bag into themselves, creating more rounded shapes. Fill bags with plastic gallon milk jugs, fold, and staple the bags closed. Spray paint bags dark gray.
4. Create a stack of rocks on top of the covered box against the papered background, taping them to the wall.
5. Print pages 2-7 onto white 8-½" x 11" paper.
6. Cut out the signs and hot glue to the front of each rock, starting with "100 BOOKS SOLD!" and working your way up to "900 BOOKS SOLD!"
7. Attach the "OUR SCHOLASTIC BOOK FAIR GOAL 1,000 BOOKS SOLD!" sign to a dowel rod with duct tape.
8. Attach the dowel rod sign above the rock pile with duct tape.
9. Place artificial greenery around the base of the covered box.





# This Way to the Book Fair Sign



## Supplies\*:

- 8 ½" x 11" white paper
- Projector
- Two 4' x 8' sheets of foam board insulation
- Black permanent marker
- Utility knife
- Light gray and dark gray spray paint
- Black and brown markers
- Spray adhesive
- Easel stand

## Directions:


1. Print the sign template on page 2 onto 8 ½" x 11" white paper.
2. Project the sign template onto a sheet of foam board insulation.
3. Trace the image onto the board with a marker.
4. Cut out the stone outline and words with a utility knife. *(For safety purposes, we recommend wearing leather gloves when using the utility knife. Never leave the utility knife where children can pick it up.)*
5. Use a utility knife to carve the cave paintings and words, avoid cutting all the way through the board.
6. Spray paint the entire piece light gray. Allow to dry.
7. Use black and brown markers to color in the carved cave paintings and words lightly.
8. Trace the outline of the entire stone sign onto another sheet of foam board insulation and cut out.
9. Spray paint the second stone dark gray. Allow to dry.
10. Attach the dark gray stone to the back of the light gray stone with spray adhesive, giving the sign a 3D affect.

3. Use duct tape to adhere signs to wooden stakes.



# Honk for the Book Fair Sign



## Supplies

- Black poster board (24" x 36")
- Masking tape or painter's tape
- Gray and white acrylic paint
- Twine or rope

## Directions:

1. Use template on pg. 2 to create the sign. Print template and project onto the black poster board, trace, then paint words and heart shape.
2. Attach twine or rope to each side of the back of the poster board with masking tape to form a loop to hang sign around front of student.

4. Tape yard sign stands to the back of the signs with duct tape.
5. Insert the signs into the ground outside the front of your school.

# Stone Age Photo Op Car




## Supplies:

- 8-½" x 11" white paper
- Projector
- Foam board insulation, 4' square
- Black permanent marker
- Utility knife
- Brown and gray paint
- Paintbrushes
- Animal print fabric, 3' x 18"
- All-purpose adhesive
- Scissors

## Directions:

1. Print the car image on page 2 onto 8-½" x 11" white paper.
2. Project the car image onto the foam board insulation at 500%.
3. Trace the car image with a marker and cut out with a utility knife. *(For safety purposes, we recommend wearing leather gloves when using the utility knife. Never leave the utility knife where children can pick it up.)*
4. Paint the car outline with brown and gray paint to match image on pg. 3, creating a wood and stone appearance. Allow to dry.
5. Cut out animal print fabric, like the image.
6. Attach the fabric to the front top of the car with an all-purpose adhesive.

# Bone Photo Prop Frame




## Supplies:

- Projector
- Foam board insulation sheet
- Black permanent marker
- Utility knife
- White spray paint
- Twine

## Directions:

1. Project pg. 2 onto the foam board insulation sheet at 100%.
2. Trace the image with the permanent marker.
3. Cut the frame out with a utility knife. *(For safety purposes we recommend wearing leather gloves when using the utility knife. Never leave the utility knife where children can pick it up.)*
4. Paint the frame white. Allow to dry.
5. Wrap twine around the frame corners in a crisscross pattern.




## Supplies:

- Projector
- Foam board insulation sheet
- Black permanent marker
- Utility knife
- White spray paint
- Twine

## Directions:

1. Project pg. 2 onto the foam board insulation sheet at 100%.
2. Trace the image with the permanent marker.
3. Cut the frame out with a utility knife. *(For safety purposes we recommend wearing leather gloves when using the utility knife. Never leave the utility knife where children can pick it up.)*
4. Paint the frame white. Allow to dry.
5. Wrap twine around the frame corners in a crisscross pattern.



# Giant Condor Wall Sign



## Supplies:

- 8-½" x 11" white paper
- Black paper roll
- Scissors
- Transparent tape
- Projector
- 20" x 30" foam board
- Spray adhesive

## Directions:

1. Print the giant condor template on pgs. 2-3 onto 8-½" x 11" white paper and tape together.
2. Roll out black paper and tape to a wall, creating an area as large as you want your finished item to be. Sample is 9' wide by 4' tall.
3. Project the template pieces onto the paper and use white chalk to trace the template.
4. Cut out the giant condor pieces and assemble them on wall with tape.
5. Print the speech bubble template on pg. 4 onto white paper at 100%. Cut out the speech bubble pieces and tape together. Tape the speech bubble to the wall next to the giant condor.
6. Print the "Did You Know . . ." sign on pg. 5 onto white printer paper at 300%. Cut out the sign pieces.
7. Use spray adhesive to piece together the sign onto the foam board. Set up the sign near the giant condor display.
8. Print out the fact on pg. 6 and tape onto the giant condor.

3. Ball up some paper and tape them to the top of the archway to build up the volume.

# Stone Age Mammoth



## Supplies\*:

- 8-½" x 11" white paper
- Projector
- Two 4' x 8' sheets of foam board insulation
- Black permanent marker
- Utility knife
- Sticky-back Velcro®
- Scissors
- Brown paint
- Paintbrush
- Furry fabric 3-4 yards
- White glue
- White pool noodle
- Wire coat hanger
- Wire cutters
- Duct tape

## Directions:


1. Using a projector, project each piece of the mammoth template from pages 4-5 onto a piece of 4' x 8' piece of foam insulation board.
2. Trace the images with a marker onto the board.



3. Cut them out using a utility knife. *(For safety purposes, we recommend wearing leather gloves when using the utility knife. Never leave the utility knife where children can pick it up.)*

\* Remember, these are only suggestions. This project should be fun and creative, so use supplies you have on hand for substitutions.





4. Glue Velcro strips along the centerline of the mammoth to secure both sections together.
5. Paint both pieces with brown paint.



6. Use fuzzy fabric to cover parts of the mammoth to your preference. We suggest trimming the fabric to shape while the mammoth pieces are put together.
7. Secure fabric with spray adhesive.

8. For the tusks, cut a pool noodle into a triangle point.
9. Paint your pool noodle white if needed.





10. Use wire to thread through the center of the pool noodle to shape the tusk and keep it in place.



11. Secure to the face of the mammoth with Velcro strips. Place one on the front of the face and one behind to create a three dimensional creature.

12. Print and cut out both layers of the mammoth's eye see page 6.
13. Glue them onto the face.
14. Cut left over foam insulation board into triangle wedges and secure to the back of the mammoth, keeping the bottom flat edge of the triangle level with the floor. These will be used as stands on the back of the creature for stability.







# Dinosaur Fossil Wall



## Supplies:

- 20 Paper towel cardboard tubes
- 60 Toilet paper cardboard tubes
- White spray paint
- White craft paper roll
- Scissors
- Projector
- Masking tape
- Black marker

## Directions:


1. Spray paint the outside of the paper towel and toilet paper rolls white. Allow to dry.
2. Project pg. 2 onto white paper at 100%.
3. Trace the image with the black marker.
4. Cut out the image and outline it.
5. Tape the head onto a wall.
6. Use the image referenced on pg. 3 to create a dinosaur skeleton.
7. Staple or tape the toilet paper rolls to the wall.





## Supplies:

- 8-½" x 11" white paper
- Projector
- One 4' x 8' sheet of foam board insulation
- Black permanent marker
- Utility knife
- Light gray and dark gray spray paint
- Black and brown markers
- Spray adhesive
- Triangular easel (Optional)
- Mounting tape (Optional)

## Directions:


1. Print the sign template on page 2 onto 8-½" x 11" white paper.
2. Project the sign template onto a 4' x 4' piece of foam board insulation.
3. Trace the image onto the board with a marker.
4. Cut out the stone outline and words with a utility knife. *(For safety purposes, we recommend wearing leather gloves when using the utility knife. Never leave the utility knife where children can pick it up.)*
5. Spray paint the entire piece light gray. Allow to dry.
6. Trace the outline of the stone sign onto another 4' x 4' piece of foam board insulation and cut out.
7. Spray paint the second stone dark gray.
8. Attach the dark gray stone to the back of the light gray stone with spray adhesive.
9. Use chalk to create tick marks indicating the number of days until the Book Fair opens.
10. Cut a large triangular easel out of excess foam board insulation and tape to the back of the sign with duct tape. Or, use mounting tape to hang on a wall.

(Erase tick marks as school counts down the days to the Book Fair opening.)

- 8-½" x 11" white paper
- Projector
- Two 4' x 8' sheets of foam board insulation

- Duct tape


1. Print the sign template on page 3 onto 8-½" x 11" white paper.
2. Project the sign template onto a sheet of 4' x 8' foam board insulation.
3. Trace the image onto the board with a marker.
4. Cut out the stone outline and the words "Stone Age Book Fair" with a utility knife (*For safety purposes, we recommend wearing leather gloves when using the utility knife. Never leave the utility knife where children can pick it up.*)

5. Use a knife to carve the cave paintings and words "READING ROCKS!", avoiding cutting all the way through the board. *(For safety purposes, we recommend wearing leather gloves when using the utility knife. Never leave the utility knife where children can pick it up.)*
6. Spray paint the boulder light gray.
7. Use a black marker to color in the carved cave paintings and the words "READING ROCKS!" lightly.
8. Trace the outline of the boulder sign onto another sheet of foam board and cut out.
9. Spray paint the second boulder dark gray.
10. Attach the dark gray boulder to the back of the light gray boulder with spray adhesive.
11. Cut a large, triangular easel and attach to the back of the sign with duct tape.

# Pile of Bones



## Supplies:

- Newspaper or newsprint paper
- Masking tape
- Eight cardboard paper towel rolls
- White spray paint

## Directions:

1. Roll a piece of newspaper into a tube shape and secure with masking tape so it retains its shape.
2. Rip two pieces of newspaper in half. Crumple up each piece tightly, creating four balls.
3. Secure each ball with masking tape so they retain their shape.
4. Attach two balls to each end of the newspaper roll with masking tape.
5. Secure the balls in place by taping in a crisscross pattern.
6. Wrap the entire length of the bones with masking tape.
7. Spray paint the bones white. Allow to dry.
8. Lay the bones on top of each other in a pile.

# Drying Rack With Fur



## Supplies:

- Five bamboo stakes
- Twine
- Scissors
- 4' x 8' foam board insulation
- Utility knife
- Brown spray paint
- Furry animal print material

## Directions:

1. Cross two bamboo stakes at the top and tie them together with twine. Repeat with two more bamboo stakes.
2. Cut foam board insulation down to two 1' x 4' pieces, creating two bases. *(For safety purposes we recommend wearing leather gloves when using the utility knife. Never leave the utility knife where children can pick it up.)*
3. Spray paint both pieces brown. Allow to dry.
4. Line up both ends of the tied-off bamboo stakes about 4" from each end of the bases.
5. Push the stakes into the bases, avoiding going all the way through.
6. Line up the tops of the tied-off bamboo stakes across from each other. Lay another bamboo stake across the tops of the tied-off bamboo stakes and tie with twine, connecting the two sides of the drying rack.\*
7. Hang a piece of furry animal print material across the drying rack.

\*Requires two people to line up bamboo stakes and tie off. Tie twine very tightly to create a drying rack sturdy enough to support material.

# Campfire



## Supplies:

- Small logs
- Twigs
- Craft bird nest
- Red, orange, and yellow tissue paper
- Stone or battery-powered tea light

## Directions:

1. Create a base for a campfire using twigs, small logs, and a craft bird nest.
2. Stack the tissue paper on top of each other in a staggered pattern.
3. Place the stone or battery-powered tea light in the center of the tissue paper stack and wrap the paper around it.
4. Set the completed flame in the center of your campfire base.
5. Fan out the tissue paper, creating faux flames.

# Table Stand Décor




## Supplies:

- Cardboard
- Hot glue
- Utility knife
- Paint
- Paintbrushes
- Green construction paper

## Directions:

1. Using the utility knife, cut out an 18" diameter circle from the cardboard. Cut the circle in half so you have two equal semi-circles. *(For safety purposes, we recommend wearing leather gloves when using the utility knife. Never leave the utility knife where children can pick it up.)*
2. Cut out a 7" x 18" rectangle to create the base.
3. Cut out two 9" x 3.5" rectangles. Fold in both ends at the 1" mark. This piece should measure 7" x 3.5" when folded. Put aside for Step 8.
4. Cut two 8" x 3.5" rectangles and fold these two pieces in half lengthwise. This piece should measure 8" x 1.75" when folded.




5. Using hot glue, adhere one of the 8" x 3.5" panels to the bottom of one of the semi-circles. See **Figure 1** for reference. Attach the second panel to the other semi-circle in the same way.



6. Glue the semi-circle and the base as shown in **Figure 2**.


7. Attach the other semi-circle to the other side of the 7" x 10" rectangle. See **Figure 3**.






8. Glue the two 7" x 3.5" pieces with the folded 1" tabs from Step 3 to connect both sides of the semi-circle as shown in **Figure 4**.

9. Use stencils from pages 3-5 to create leaves out of various shades of green construction paper.
10. Paint the stands green and hot glue leaves to decorate.







# Bone Table Legs



## Supplies:

- Meter stick
- Mailing tubes (one tube per table leg)
- Utility knife
- Newspaper
- Masking tape
- Scissors
- White spray paint

## Directions:

1. Measure your table legs. Cut the mailing tubes to about 3" less than that measurement.
2. Cut a line all the way down each mailing tube so they can slip around the table legs.
3. Create the tops and bottoms of each bone by wrapping masking tape around tightly crumpled newspaper balls.
4. Tape one paper ball on either side of mailing tubes on the top and bottom, with the cut line running down the middle.
5. Secure the paper balls to the mailing tubes by taping in a crisscross pattern.
6. Cut any tape that covers the cut line running down the middle of the mailing tube.
7. Spray paint the bones white. Allow to dry.
8. Fit bones around table legs.

4. Use a glue stick to affix each teacher's photo to a red pocket. Write names under each photo.
5. Cut 6" long pieces of brown yarn.
6. Gather four pieces of yarn and tie a knot in the middle. Repeat for each pocket.
7. Attach the yarn hair to the teachers' pictures with a hot glue gun, creating a cave dweller appearance.
8. Glue the pockets onto the display board. Only seal three out of the four sides.







- Clear paint cans

- 8-½" x 11" white paper
- Brown construction paper
- Pencil
- Masking tape

## Mammoth Directions:

1. Cut a 4.5" wide strip out of furry brown material to wrap completely around the clear paint can.
2. Apply glue to the material and wrap around the paint can. Allow to dry.
3. Glue a tuft of material on the top center of the paint can between the handles, creating the hair for the mammoth's head.
4. Print the mammoth face template on pg. 2 onto white paper and cut out.
5. Trace the mammoth face template onto the brown craft paper.
6. Cut the mammoth face out and fold it in half vertically.
7. Print the mammoth eyes on pg. 3 onto white paper and cut out.
8. Glue the eyes onto the mammoth face, like shown.
9. Roll a sheet of 8-½" x 11" paper into a tight cone and then flatten out.
10. Secure the flattened cone with masking tape.
11. Wrap the entire flattened cone with masking tape. Then slightly roll it to resemble a curved tusk.
12. Repeat steps 9-11 to create a second tusk.
13. Adjust the size of the tusks with scissors, if needed, and glue to the back of the mammoth face, like shown.
14. Glue the face with tusks to the paint can.







**Saber Tooth Tiger Directions:**

1. Cut a 4.5" wide strip out of black paper to wrap completely around the clear paint can.

3. Print the tiger face templates on pgs. 4-8 onto white paper and cutout.
4. Trace the tiger face templates onto different colored construction paper. Use brown paper for face, black paper for stripes, white paper for teeth, and yellow paper for eyes. Cut out the pieces.
5. Glue the face together using the photo and template as guides. Allow to dry.
6. Glue the completed face onto the paint can, like shown.
7. Cut irregular strips out of brown paper, creating tiger stripes. Glue them along the black paper band on the paint can.




## Directions:


1. Print the giant sloth template on pgs. 2-5 onto 8-½" x 11" white paper.
2. Roll out black paper and tape to a wall, creating an area as large as you want your finished item to be. Sample is 9' wide by 4' tall.
3. Project the template pieces onto the paper and use white chalk to trace the template.
4. Cut out the giant sloth and assemble on a wall with tape. Use the template on page 6 as a guide for assembling the silhouette.
5. Research giant sloths and choose an interesting fact to showcase, or use the one provided on page 7. Sample shows size and dimensions as a comparison for students to observe. Create a digitally produced or handmade sign featuring the fact and tape to the middle of the giant sloth silhouette.
6. Tile print the speech bubble template on pg. 8 onto white printer paper at 100%. Cut out the speech bubble pieces and tape together. Tape the completed speech bubble to the wall next to the giant sloth.
7. Tile print the "Did You Know . . ." sign on pg. 9 onto white printer paper at 300%. Cut out the sign pieces.
