



APPRECIATING LITERATURE

A LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

There are many different ways for children to engage with literature, ranging from their personal preferences to the ways in which texts reflect the culture and situation in which they are created. Through engagement with literature, children learn about themselves, each other and the world.

Responding to literature has always been central to students' encounters with language. As such, students should read a range of literature, including popular literature, traditional stories, children's literature, and literary texts with established critical reputations.

The New Zealand English curriculum affirms the importance of literature for literacy development, for imaginative development, and for developing personal, social, cultural, historical and national awareness and identity.

The big challenge for teachers is not simply getting students to read—it's getting them to enjoy it too. By choosing uninteresting texts, by over assessing reading performance, and by treating reading as a chore, we sometimes degrade what love of reading a child may have. That's why it's so important we draw on a variety of approaches to the study of literature and offer an ever evolving selection of texts.

As teachers, you are best placed to make decisions about the selection of texts in your programs, so I do hope the following offers in Teacher Essentials each issue help you to do just that:







THE PROUDEST BLUE

BY IBTIHAJ MUHAMMAD & S. K. ALI, ILLUSTRATED BY HATEM ALY

BEFORE READING

Based on the cover, what do you think this story is about? How do you think it will begin/end? After reading, revisit your answer to this question. Were your predictions correct? Consider the subtitle: 'A Story of Hijab and Family'. What do students already know about wearing hijab? Do they have any questions about it? Make a list of statements and questions the students may have about wearing hijab.

EXPLORING THE TEXT

The first day of wearing hijab is an important moment for Asiya and her family. Does your religion, culture or family have any special traditions that are important to you? What does this tradition mean to you?

"Some people won't understand your hijab...
but if you understand who you are, one
day they will too." Discuss this quote with
the class, and revisit the statements and
questions you had about wearing hijab.
Have students' understanding of hijab
changed? Can the class now answer any
of the questions they may have had?

"Don't carry around the hurtful words that others say. Drop them. They belong only to those that said them." What do you think this statement means? How are Asiya and Faizah affected by hurtful words in the story? Use this quote to have a class discussion about the powerful effect words can have on others. What is your understanding of prejudice?

What are the dangers of making judgements about people based on race, gender, age, sexuality, etc. rather than understanding that every person is different? How is prejudice shown in *The Proudest Blue?*

What policies does your school have in place regarding bullying, racism and prejudice? Can you add to or improve these policies? What should you do if you witness a student or teacher demonstrating bullying, racist or prejudiced behaviour?

EXPLORING THE ILLUSTRATIONS

Examine several of the spreads and have a class discussion about the following:

- What is the composition (i.e. where are the key elements placed)? Are the characters large or small? In the foreground or background? Do they seem powerful or weak; happy or sad; scared or confident?
- What are the characters on this page doing and where are they looking? Why are they doing this? What effect does this have?
- Is the illustration framed or does it take up the whole page? Why do you think Hatem Aly illustrated it this way?
- Do the colours change from spread to spread? Make a list of the colours used in each area (this is called the colour palette). Why do you think he chose these colour palettes?

Asiya, Faizah and their friends are in colour and illustrated in detail, but the bullies are not. Why do you think the illustrator made this choice? How does it affect you as a reader? Have a wider discussion about how bullying is presented in *The Proudest Blue*, including how Asiya and her friends react to the bullies.


Consider the spreads where Faizah is describing her sister's hijab. How are they similar or different to other spreads in the book? You could consider the text, the colours, and the size of the characters. Why do you think they've been presented in this way? How does it make you feel?

FURTHER ACTIVITIES

Faizah goes through a range of emotions in the story. Look at each spread and discuss how she may be feeling, and how you can tell using clues from the text and illustrations. For each emotion, ask students to consider when they have experienced a similar emotion and how it made them feel.


Family is an important theme in *The Proudest Blue*. Ask students to write a short piece about a family member they feel close to and share it with the class. Read the author notes from Ibtihaj Muhammad and S. K. Ali. How did they make you feel? Did they inspire or encourage you? Research Ibtihaj Muhammad and make a fact sheet about her achievements.





CROSSING

BY CATHERINE NORTON

BEFORE READING

Crossing is a novel of a dystopian society, set in an unspecified country at an unspecified time. While it might technically be considered a fantasy novel, in many ways it is reminiscent of realistic fiction. The cover art is powerful, and every element has a direct symbolic relationship with key features within the story. A class discussion of what defines a novel as fantasy, and of the symbolic relevance of the cover art, would be a valuable exercise in introducing this gripping and challenging story.

THEMES, SYMBOLISM, AND LITERARY DEVICES

The most easily identifiable literary theme in Crossing is that of enclosure and confinement as symbolised by the Wall. From the first chapter, it is clear that the Wall has a profound psychological impact on the characters, and Cara's gradual realisation of other, metaphorical walls that influence her life and actions is a key element of the novel. Other themes and devices present that are worth discussion are those of personal growth and forgiveness, and how the physical environment can be a reflection of a mental landscape.

HISTORIC PARALLELS

The parallels between the Berlin Wall and the Wall in Crossing are readily apparent. Some study of the Berlin Wall and its past and current impact on the German population would greatly enhance students' interpretation of the events and viewpoints presented within the novel. Conversely, studying Crossing as an adjunct to a modern history unit dealing with post WWII Europe would facilitate students' comprehension of the long and short term ramifications of the Berlin Wall, and the probable motivations and responses of the historic people involved in its inception.

PLOT CONSTRUCTION, VIEWPOINT AND PERSPECTIVE

Topics for discussion:

- What are the reasons an author might choose to use first person and present tense to tell a story?
- How does the past story affect your understanding and interpretation of the present story? Why might the author have chosen this structure?
- How does the order in which you, the reader, find out what has happened, affect your response to the story?

- How is your knowledge of Cara and of the significance of events affected?
- Think about how the order of revealing facts about Cara and her life influences the tension in the novel. How does heightening the tension change a story?

CREATIVE ACTIVITIES

- Throughout human history, stories have been used as a metaphorical wall to try to keep people from going places and doing things. As a class, brainstorm as many instances of this as you can (fairytales are a good example). Write a short story designed to keep small children away from a dangerous feature near where you live (river/lake/busy road).
- On a map of your home (or closest) city or town, draw a line directly through the middle. Make a list of all the things on your side of the line that are important, (libraries, schools, shops, sporting arenas, farms, parks, hospitals, dentists, rivers etc.) and a second list of things on the other side. Think about how life would have to change if suddenly people on one side couldn't get to the other side! Write two short paragraphs, from the perspective of two people on opposite sides of your imaginary wall, talking about all the things they can't do any more.



THE READING WARS

Why incorporating indigenous language into the reading mix is so important

UR SCHOOL VISION SPEAKS of developing 'assessment capable learners' and providing 'learning experiences that uphold the school values, the New Zealand Curriculum, Te Tiriti o Waitangi and the principles of cultural competency'. High quality children's literature is the key to engaging children of any culture in learning. Celebrating Te Reo Māori as a language in contemporary books is a well overdue development. I would like to thank Scholastic for being strongly committed to Ao Māori, allowing the learners of our nation to develop a positive appreciation of Māori language and tikanga.

Today, there is a battle for the hearts and minds of both adults and children in respect of literature. Deep learning, resulting from reading high quality books, is under threat from appealing, addictive, interactive social media channels. We have had to employ high quality pedagogies to overcome the attraction of social media and maintain

that love of reading in our children. We have also had to examine our reading environments and lift their appeal for our young people. Our classrooms and central libraries have also been transformed into vibrant, interesting places and are regularly refreshed. The selection, diversity and turnover of books is focused on keeping children engaged in reading for both pleasure and for information. As school principal, I wanted to establish my role in 'The Reading War' that was erupting around us. Given all my other responsibilities of running a school, I couldn't commit to a regular weekly teaching session in deep learning. But the answer came in 2019.

Robyn Southam from Scholastic New Zealand presented me with a glossy red handbag filled with the very best titles from the Scholastic range and over time she has generously added to my 'arsenal'. I requested some bilingual titles as I regularly interact with children who identify as Māori and read to them in my office. Some of these children experience challenges in accessing the curriculum in the classroom setting, and my aim was to establish learning relationships with them to support them to see themselves as Māori readers and learners. My very generous teachers willingly agreed to accommodate my random visits to their class. Now, when I turn up with my red handbag of books, the children get very excited.

Reading stories that were culturally relevant was a great starting point for the children to examine their whakapapa. Several years ago I was encouraged by Keri Milne-Ihimaera and Peter Witana on the New Zealand Principals' Federation executive, to create a learning environment where Māori children could experience success as Māori. The varied bilingual texts I share with children enable us to talk about koro, kuia, and other whanau and friends, until we find somebody we know in common. This is a powerful touchpoint for any child and opens a window for a successful learning relationship.

As an early participant in the Māori Achievement Collaborative (MAC) led by Hoana Pearson, I was further confronted by the learning environment, assessment practices and the impact of colonisation on the aspirations and perceptions of Māori learners. Just as the physical symbols, including the school logo and whakatauki, had to be changed, so did the diet of literature and version of New Zealand we were sharing. We are now in our fourth year using Tamsin Hanly's A Critical Guide to Māori and Pākehā Histories of Aotearoa. The use of Tasmin's texts has deepened our teachers' and children's understanding, and it has addressed colonial and racist mental models, and enabled us to be more culturally responsive about how we deliver curriculum. Changing hearts and minds and learning to appreciate and embrace a Māori world view requires leadership that is committed to the kaupapa of biculturalism. That is where I like to think my school is now.

Reading bilingual texts to classes and groups of children, enables me to reinforce their existing use of Te Reo Māori in and out of the classroom. The children look forward to my visits and expect me to challenge them. They use what they already know as I introduce them to new words, phrases and concepts. The process serves as a continuing validation of the language and kaupapa for all children, but particularly those who identify as Māori.
