

Lollipop Pull Instructions

Supplies*:

- Duct tape
- Insulation board with a thickness of 2cm or more
- Piece of 30cm x 30cm cardboard
- White cardstock paper
- Blue cardstock paper
- Yellow-orange paint
- Orange paint
- Medium brown paint
- Medium brown marker
- Brown marker
- Bag of lollipops
- Glue



Directions:

1. Cut out a circle with a diameter of 86cm.
2. Cut off a little of the fish's body on the bottom so that it will rest flat on the floor, or a table, as shown in Figure 1.
3. Use the tail stencil provided on page 3 to project onto a piece of insulation foam. The length of the tail should be approximately 43cm.
4. Tape the tail to the body using the duct tape. Make sure all of the edges where the tail and body meet are seamless as shown in Figure 2.
5. Project the fin stencil on page 3 onto a piece of cardboard and cut out.
6. Tape the front side of the fin as shown in Figure 3.
7. Flip the fin over and tape the back edge as shown in Figure 4.

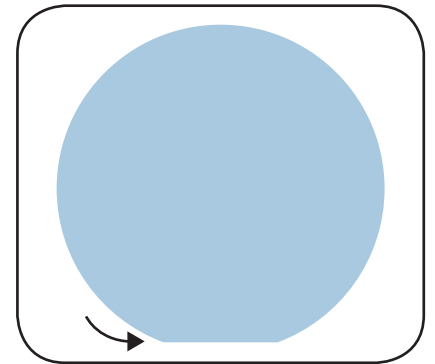

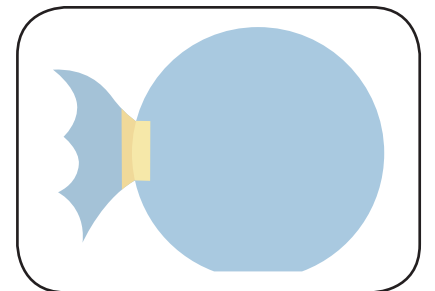

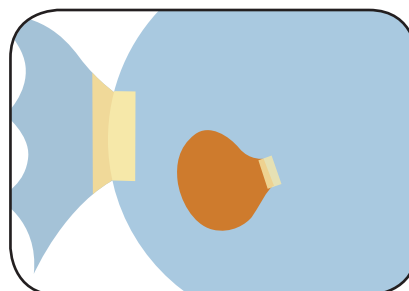

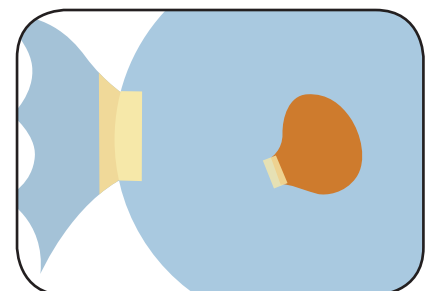

*Remember, these are only suggestions. This project should be fun and creative, so use whatever supplies you have on-hand for substitutions.

8. Paint the bottom half of the body of the fish, including its fin, yellow-orange as shown in Figure 5.

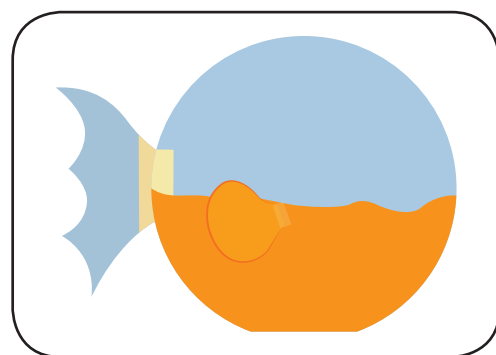

9. Paint the top half and tail orange as shown in Figure 6.

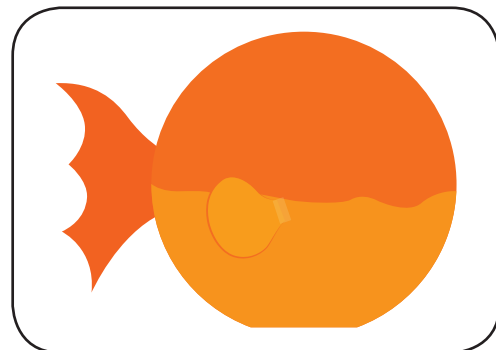

10. Use the brown paint and marker to add the spots and details on the fish as shown in Figure 7.
11. Cut two ovals out of the white cardstock to create the eyes.
12. Cut two ovals out of the blue cardstock to create the pupils.
13. Cut out two smaller white circles to create the highlight on the eyes.

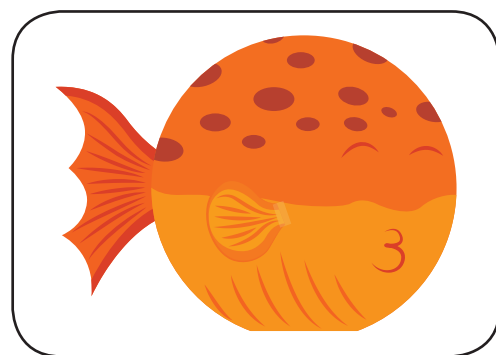

14. Assemble the eyes with glue and paste to the fish as shown in Figure 8.

15. To make the stand, make two triangles from left over insulation board. Make adjustments to height and angle of the stand as needed.
16. Secure the stands to the back of the fish with duct tape.
17. Poke holes throughout the blowfish to hold lollipops using a thick nail, tip of a pen, or tip of small scissors.

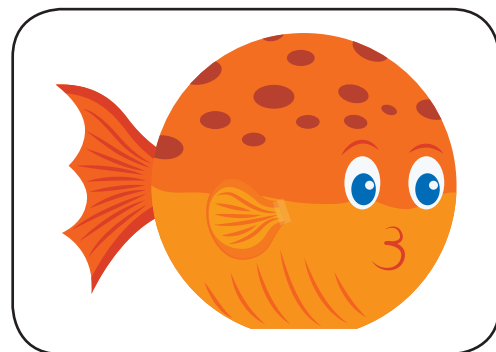

18. Colour one end of a lollipop.
19. Poke the lollipops into the premade holes.
